Pursuant to Article 92, paragraph 4, and Article 93, paragraph 4, of the Constitution of the Republic of Kosovo, pursuant to Article 4 of Regulation no. 02/2021 on Areas of Administrative Responsibilities of the Office of the Prime Minister and Ministries, as well as in accordance with Article 19 of the Rules of Procedure of the Government of the Republic of Kosovo No. 09/2011, the Government of the Republic of Kosovo, in its session held on 11 August 2021, adopted the following:

DECISION

1. The Action Plan for implementation of the second phase of political priorities agreed between the European Union and the Republic of Kosovo – the European Reform Program (ERA II AP) is hereby approved.
2. All responsible institutions of the Republic of Kosovo, as per the ERA II Action Plan, are obliged to implement it, in line with the timeframes.
3. The budget for the implementation of the ERA II Action Plan, for the activities envisaged for 2021, remains within the budget allocations of budget organisations for this year and in line with the Medium-Term Expenditure Framework. All institutions responsible for its implementation are obliged to provide the budget funds necessary for implementation of the measures envisaged for 2022 and 2023.
4. All institutions of the Republic of Kosovo responsible for implementation of the ERA II Action Plan are obliged to take all necessary measures to ensure that it is in line with their internal work plans and other relevant documents.
5. The General Secretary of the Office of the Prime Minister shall submit the ERA II Action Plan to the Assembly for adoption.
6. The present decision shall enter into force on the day of its publication in the Official Gazette of the Republic of Kosovo.

Buxheti për zbatimin e Planit të Veprimit ERA II, për veprimet e parapara për vitin 2021, mbetet brenda ndarjeve buxhetore të organizatave buxhetore për këtë vit dhe në pajtim me Kornizën Afatmesme të Shpenzimeve. Të gjitha institucionet përgjegjëse për zbatimin e tij obligohen që të sigurojnë resurset e nevojshme buxhetore për zbatimin e veprimeve të parapara për vitin 2022 dhe 2023.
4. Obligohen të gjitha institucionet përgjegjëse për zbatimin e Planit të Veprimit ERA II që të ndër marrin të gjitha masat e nevojshme që ai të ndërlidhet me planet e tyre të brendshme të punës dhe me dokumentet e tjera relevante.
5. Obligohet Sekretari i Përgjithshëm i Zyrës së Kryeministrit që ta dorëzoj Planin e Veprimit ERA II për miratim në Kuvendin e Republikës së Kosovës.
6. Vendimi hyn në fuqi ditën e publikimit në Gazetën Zyrtare të Republikës së Kosovës.

Introduction

The **Stabilisation and Association Agreement (SAA) between the EU and Kosovo** entered into force on 1 April 2016. The Agreement is the first formal contractual relationship that ties the EU and Kosovo together. It offers opportunities and incentives for Kosovo to strengthen good governance and rule of law, as well as boost economic growth and employment. It provides for the development of a gradual free trade area with the EU, helps attracting foreign and domestic investment, and improving the business environment.

In order to **prioritise the reforms expected as part of the SAA implementation**, Kosovo and the EU have set up in 2016 the European Reform Agenda (ERA) process. Since 2016, the ERA has become the key guidance tool for Kosovo institutions on EU-related reforms.

A **first phase of the ERA (ERA I)** was agreed in November 2016. Since then, Kosovo has made some real progress in the intervening time on delivering on the reform commitments undertaken. It introduced a three pillar focus on i) Good Governance and Rule of Law, ii) Competitiveness and Investment Climate, and iii) Education and Employment.

Kosovo and the EU have now agreed to launch a **second phase of ERA (ERA II)**, which builds on the reforms and progress undertaken to date. This new agenda of priority reforms retains the three pillar approach, which has proven very relevant, while also reflecting the evolving context and priorities. In particular, in the context of the **COVID-19** pandemic, ERA II includes priorities related to the mitigation of the economic and social impact of the crisis, as well as a new focus on the health sector. Likewise, ERA II puts additional focus on reform areas related to the European Commission's **Economic and Investment Plan** adopted on 6 October 2020, such as the **green transition**. In the **rule of law** pillar, there is a new focus on electoral reform process, fundamental human rights, and home affairs.

Finally, ERA II priorities are fully consistent with recommendations contained in the European Commission's **2020 Kosovo Report** and with the **2020 Joint Conclusions of the Economic and Financial Dialogue** between the EU and the Western Balkans and Turkey.

A key emphasis of this second phase of ERA will be on the **implementation and enforcement of legislation and reforms** enacted under the first phase of ERA in order to ensure a real difference for citizens, businesses and investors.

Based on the priorities agreed with the EU, the Government of Kosovo - in close consultation with the EU and with the contribution of civil society - has prepared the two-year ERA Action Plan (PV ERA II), which is intended to be implemented by mid-2023. PV ERA II has defined in detail and with clear deadlines specific, realistic, measurable and achievable actions to achieve these ambitious priorities.

Next steps: after the adoption of PV ERA II will continue with its implementation and monitoring. This process will be led by the Government, which will work closely with the European Commission. This process will also directly involve independent institutions that have concrete implementation tasks, while the Government will also work closely with civil society in this regard.

The Assembly of Kosovo will play an important role in the implementation and monitoring of ERA II, in particular in the implementation of reforms under its direct responsibility, the adoption of laws and the oversight of the work of the Government in the overall implementation process.

Similarly, the engagement of **civil society** has been essential to the preparation of PV ERA II and should be so in monitoring its implementation. For this purpose, joint and public consultations were organized with civil society before finalizing the action plan. Regular and structured monitoring consultations with civil society will also be organized throughout its implementation.

A **firm commitment by Kosovo's political leaders to these reforms** is needed, reforms that will deliver real opportunities for all of society. The fulfilment of priority actions will assist in implementing the SAA and advancing Kosovo on its European path. The implementation of ERA II will be reviewed annually.
